How to Enter your entries at the 2025 Caboolture Show

OPTION 1 - ONLINE ENTRIES

1. Register or Login using (show day) or find links on our website. You can either make payment at this time or select cash payment on the day.
2. Take your completed entry forms and entries to the sections steward to enter.
3. Take paperwork to show office to make payment.
(Entries will only be valid if paid for at the show office or online)

OPTION 2 - ON THE DAY ENTRIES

1. Complete a general entry form which can be collected from the show office or downloaded from our website.
2. Take your completed entry forms and entries to the sections steward to enter.
3. Take paperwork to show office to make payment.

(Entries will only be valid if paid for at the show office or online)

GENERAL RULES

1. Entry form must accompany exhibit and be handed to the relevant steward, in the Lindsay pavilion.
2. If it is necessary to post your entry or deliver your entry early. ALL ENTRIES ARE TO BE RECEIVED by Friday 30th May 2025. Sent to Hobby Steward, C/- Caboolture Show Society, PO Box 266, Caboolture, 4510.
3. All other exhibits to be left with the relevant steward at the Lindsay Pavilion 10 am till 2pm on the Saturday 31st May 2025 or 10am till 5pm Wednesday 4th June 2025. No late entries will be Accepted.
4. Entry Fees: \$2 Non-Members, \$1.50 Members & 1.00 Juniors Per Entry Unless Stated Otherwise.
5. Scarecrows \$5 per entry and prize divisions are 1st \$20, 2nd \$10 & 3rd \$5.
6. All exhibits must be of the original design or creation of the exhibitor, to be not more than 12 months old and not previously entered in this show.
7. Where trophies or prizes have been donated, these will take the place of prize money.
8. Unless otherwise stated, First prize is \$10.00, Second prize is \$5.00.
9. **General Guidelines that apply to all ages & classes in Hobbies. - Beading, Papercraft, Scrapbooking, Folk art, 5D Diamond Painting, Ceramic's, Woodwork & Scarecrows**
10. The judges will be looking for a high standard of delivery in workmanship, choice of materials, Colour co-ordination, presentation of technique, innovation & creativity. All work must be the work of the exhibitor and not entered a show or won a prize before. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have their name covered on the entered exhibit prior to handing it over to the steward.
11. Prize money to be collected at the Secretary's Office after 3pm on Friday 6th June until 5pm on Sunday 8th June. Any prize monies not collected by 5pm will become a donation to the Caboolture District P. A. & I. Assn Ltd.
12. Stewards shall be in attendance from 3.30pm Sunday to deliver out exhibits to owners (please have entry receipt).
13. The Association accepts no responsibility for loss or damage or return postage or costs if mailed or railed. The Association may place in their correct section, exhibits considered entered the incorrect section. The Association reserves the right to declare no competition if insufficient entries are received in any section.
14. Completed entry forms must accompany entries.
15. The Judge need not award any prize to an exhibit that in his/her opinion does not comply with the conditions.
16. The Judge may award Second Prize if the exhibit is not worthy of first, shall not award any prize if the Exhibit is not considered to be of sufficient merit.
