1. **Nominations Online ONLY – Nominations via Showday Online – Showjumping.**
2. **Nominations Close Thursday 4th June 2026.**
3. STABLE BOOKINGS: Via Caboolture Showgrounds website.
4. Riders Please Note: Competitors must comply with directions from all Show Society Officials. EA rules apply.
5. Committee reserve the rights to alter program without notification.
6. HORSE HEALTH DEC MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE COMPETING.
7. Maximum two starts per horse each day.
8. Champion Rider - points scored on any one horse will decide Champion IE any rider could place 1st, 2nd and 3rd if they compete on more than one horse. Points 6,5,4,3,2,1. Junior classes do not count for Champion rider.
9. Prize money to be collected at the Secretary's Office after 3pm on Friday 6th June until 5pm on Sunday 8th June. Any prize monies not collected by 5pm will become a donation to the Caboolture District P. A. & I. Assn Ltd.

HORSE EVENT RULES

1. These conditions are to be read in conjunction with the Show Society's General Instructions.
2. This Show is conducted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and constitution and rules of this schedule.
3. All riders, drivers and competitors compete at their own risk and no responsibility is accepted by the Caboolture and District Pastoral, Agricultural and Industrial Association Ltd or its servants in any respect for any account or mishap to competitors, animals, property, or onlookers which may occur.
4. The age of a horse shall be calculated from the first day of August. Every horse foaled before the first of August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date.
5. The Mounted Steward will control participants as he sees fit and may demand an entrant's card on entry to the ring. His orders must be obeyed without question.
6. No ring shall be required to wait for a competitor who may be competing in another ring.
7. If in the opinion of the judge any horse or pony is entered in the wrong class, the judge shall have the power to classify it in the correct class.
8. A maiden is a horse that has not won a first prize in a similar event at an affiliated Show.
9. A Novice horse is one, which has never won an Open Championship at any Agricultural Show.
10. Stallions are not permitted in hack classes.
11. Pony Hacks must not exceed 14 hands.
12. Pony Hacks must be ridden by a rider under 17 years of age.
13. A Galloway Hack shall be over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands.
14. All horses must have a current height certificate acceptable to Caboolture P.A. & I Association.
15. A Judge or Steward may direct any person or horse from the competition for bad conduct of one or both.

16. It is recommended that signed performance cards be completed by the Show Steward rather than the Judge during the continuance of the Show.
17. Judges must be suitably attired in either riding clothes or neat street attire when judging.
18. An Exhibit is ineligible to compete if the horse has been owned or leased by the judge, a member of his/her family, his employer or business partner within the last three months.
19. An Exhibit is ineligible to compete if the Competitor/Exhibitor has given tuition by the Judge or trained a horse owned or leased by the Judge, within the last three months.
20. A Judge shall not visit the horse stables or the owners, nor inspect or discuss any horse entered in the show prior to or during the judging of the relevant section.
21. No Competitor/Exhibitor shall deface or alter registration papers or performance cards.
22. An Exhibitor shall ensure that horse and Competitor are entered and shown only in the correct class.
23. No Competitor or Exhibitor or member of their family shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain permission from the Ring Master or Ring Steward.
24. In Breed classes all horses must be registered with their particular Breed Society.
25. In Breed classes registration papers must be available as proof of registration if required.
26. Certain breeds and colours of horses of great interest to Horse Associations and public alike judged at Caboolture's Annual Show on merit and excellence, the predominant factor being award of the Caboolture Show Society's sash, NOT financial gain. The criterion is QUALITY. The Show Society will foster and further the activities and interests of all Horse Associations or Clubs, which cooperate by providing judges/stewards. Horse Associations should contact the Secretary promptly each year advising of their need in a Schedule and the extent of their material help offered.
27. A Show Society may carry out random tests for drugs in horses.
28. All classes are to assemble in the Marshalling Yard prior to entry into the Main Ring for the event. Classification, etc, is conducted here under the direction of the Chief Steward.
29. Any protest must be lodged in writing to the Ring Master or Ring Steward within 30 minutes of the completion of the event accompanied by a fee of \$50. This amount will be forfeited if such protest is considered frivolous by the disputes committee of three persons appointed by the Show Committee. The decision of the disputes committee shall be final and without appeal except that any exhibitor shall have the right of appealing against disqualification imposed as provided for in the constitution of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies.
30. Juniors cannot compete in both graded and Junior events on the same horse No electric fences are allowed on the grounds during the period of the show and the Societies' Workplace Health and Safety Officers are authorized to cut and remove same without notice,
31. All dogs must be restrained and kept within the camping area. If not restrained, they will be reported to the CSC Compliance Officers for impounding.
32. All livestock to enter via Gate 3 Beerburrum Road Caboolture.
33. NOTE: ALL ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT AND LEADS ARE TO FULLY COMPLY WITH AS - NZS 3002 - 2008 and 3760 - 2010.
